be held on campus. We will do our best to go by all of the guidelines so that everyone receives the proper information on how to remain safe and healthy while we're in the classes. The vice presidents will be working with the deans in consultation with the faculty and others, to determine which classes those are and also to develop a strategy on how to offer those classes. So, more to come on that. I would recommend that we start the planning process for that sooner than later. That way it gives everyone as much tie as possible to help prepare for the type of environment that they'll be teaching in.

- There was also concern about PPE and protection equipment. We will have those conversations. And again, you
 know, faculty and others will be involved to determine what the need is and how we're going to acquire the proper
 equipment.
- The virtual commencement is moving right along. The one thing though, I do want to address is rumor control, if you will. There was a young lady on social media that started a petition not to have a virtual commencement. In reading her several posts, I think there's a misunderstanding that we are doing the virtual commencement and that's all we're going to do for the class of 2020. The plan always been to invite the class of 2020 to the commencement of the class of 2021.. But we also need to recognize that we need to do something, some sort of celebration for our students this year. And this was the best way we knew how to do it. And in fact, the students that I spoke with, they are truly excited about it; so much that the Associated Students passed a resolution in support of having a virtual commencement. So, I just wanted you to be aware of that in case students are asking you and saying they want a more traditional commencement. There's still that opportunity for them and we will be sending out invitations for them to participate.
- Some of you have asked about CARES funding. The government has issued each of the campuses a certain amount
 of money to distribute to students so that they can meet their basic needs in light of the pandemic. So we have not,
 district-wide, including Crafton, have not received that funding and we are in the process of determining a way in
 which to distribute those dollars to students. So more to come on that.
- I know this is the last senate meeting, so I will include information in my bi-monthly emails that I send to update the campus.
- Congratulations to all of the award winners. How exciting is that? And how lucky are we? How lucky am I to be on your team? So congratulations! That's a huge recognition for all of the work that you have been doing, so kudos.
- My last thing is C. Huston. Thank you so much for your leadership and what you've been able to accomplish for your team and the faculty and the respect you've given across the district. We appreciate your collegial approach and commitment to our conversation; I think in the first week of my arrival we discussed no surprises on either side. Thank you for that approach. We've had a lot of difficult conversations. I appreciate that you've never given up. C. Huston is a fierce advocate for faculty. She's never given up when things were truly difficult. She looks for ways to compromise and meet in the middle so everyone wins. I appreciate our late-night or weekend conversations, both in person and in text. That's part of her advocacy.
