  - Conectado website (link in email to senators is not public yet). We have an org that the district contracted with. They help organizations work with AI. Full transparency, they were brought to us, we didn't seek them out. We want to work with them to make it more relevant to us. They also consult with businesses, but partnerships with educational institutions are small scale. Rania and Kashaunda went to them and shared our needs leading into the institute. We still want additional feedback, but they already updated the curriculum based on what we shared. Proposed start is March. It can be done as 2-3 sessions via Zoom or 1 longer in person then the rest on Zoom. It's about an 8-hour commitment, but how that's split hasn't been updated yet.

  - T. Vasquez: Has the PD committee seen this? Faculty have been dealing with AI for a long time and we know what we need. There's concern around where we're investing money.
  - J. Jorgensen: I appreciate the revamping of it. The middle sessions you were reviewing might overlap with Conmigo, the AI Canvas tool.
  - R. Hamdy: we will let Conectado know about the tool we use
  - S. Valle: Are they going to teach students?
  - R. Hamdy: No, the contract is for employees only, it's not for students right now.
  - M. Robles: Can they include environmental impacts to allow students to understand the environmental impacts of overusing AI?
  - K. Lyons: CSU is rolling out ChatGPT Edu, so it might be worthwhile to see what else is out there.
  - J. Lemieux: I'm an AI enthusiast, I follow it closely, I question the value of this investment that the district has made. Check out the Conectado YouTube channel. If we do anything with AI, it would be great to consult the experts, such as our Computer Science Department, and other faculty on campus who are experts in this.
  - T. Berry: I want to agree with Jessy and piggyback that ASCCC and CCCCO have a lot of AI stuff out there to use.

  - ASPIRE Year 2 reflections with resource requests were submitted by areas on/by Jan. 27.
  - Resource Requests updates: Resource requests have been sent out to corresponding divisions and areas for the prioritization process, due back by Feb. 18, after which time the committee will review and send to College Council for determination of funding
  - The Committee will be focusing this semester on reading the submissions and providing feedback to those who submitted and college leadership on emergent trends.
    - We are continuing to make changes to the online form and process based on our experience and feedback received.
    - We're processing roll-over resource requests this wasn't automated and we realized that might be an area to streamline for the future.
    - For those who may be thinking ahead to next year's reflection process, the focus will be on Demand & Currency of the program
    - First meeting is Friday 2/7/25.
  - Ask from T. Vasquez: PR committee evaluate Technology and Facilities/Safety requests made, but aren't in process for all chairs to see. Also for process itself – ranking is different within ASPIRE vs. Technology and Facilities/Safety. Before it was pretty straightforward, but we aren't really seeing how all the requests are being ranked. As we transition into ASPIRE, we want to see those processes.

- Welcome to Spring semester. Thanks to Andrea and Senate for acknowledging John. I know I didn't work with him as closely as many of you. His reach extended throughout the CCC system. He meant a lot to everyone.
- Today was a special day, and the Black History Month presentation was great. Dr. Emdin was talking to me individually. There were so many ways to apply what he said. Thinking, "Why are we having these conversations?" and "How do I apply that to my role as president?" One thing was, "love." Get to know our students as people first. How do we answer that collective "Why?"
- Enrollment up 15%. Students are back on campus. There's a lot going on in the world. I call upon the faculty please have grace for students who are dealing with all of that and still showing up for school. Validate their experiences. Humanize their interactions.
- To respond to D. Knight, I came from colleges that outlined how to select interim roles, in addition to the AP/BP. Making faculty whole as they return to faculty positions, but also that's a challenge because things change. I hope the participatory governance handbook can help.

- We now officially have an Education Policy and Procedure Subcommittee. We'll meet on the 4<sup>th</sup> Wednesday of each month, and our 1<sup>st</sup> meeting is next week.
- Next PPAC meeting is February 20<sup>th</sup>.
- o BP 2510 is shared governance, which is the center of what we do. I did send a written report but the links broke, so I sent all of the senators a new copy with correct links. I'll work with J. Salyer to get the written report updated as well. We'll collectively bring a report from PPAC and submit it to the chairs of PPAC, K. Hannon and J. Torres. BP 2510 is special in that last year we had a proposal go through to the BOT, but was pending until November. Then it came to the BOT for 1<sup>st</sup> read and was going to go to a 2<sup>nd</sup> read before we came back in January. We asked for it to be extended so we can give feedback. We want to find more representative language that aligns with shared governance. We will bring that back to the Feb 19<sup>th</sup> meeting.

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- 5.3. AB 1705 State Update and Proposal for Resolution, Tatiana Vasquez

  - o AB 1705 Update
  - T. Vasquez emailed faculty. We were supposed to discontinue courses below Calculus for STEM majors. This was not decided with faculty involved.
  - FACCC are working to support our needs as faculty and they are activating faculty on AB 1705.
  - We are a little behind as a college; there were adopted resolutions relating to AB 1705 at the ASCCC fall plenary (105.06 F24, 114.03 F24). How are our students being prepared to get to Calculus? Right now students are going straight into Calculus I without preparatory work, unless they decide they want it.
  - In the Science Division, we are struggling with students who are not prepared with the skill to work at the Calculus level. This also includes critical thinking skills.
  - o It's not only affecting math, it's affecting English as well.
  - As a Senate, we have an AB 1705 taskforce. We can do more. If you want to participate
    in writing a resolution locally, let me know. This could also be taken to the state level.
  - Upcoming hearing on oversight of AB 1705.
