

Catalog Rights Update

Current SBVC Graduation Catalog

Rights Policy:

A student may elect to meet graduation requirements in any one of the following ways:

- Did not include students taking classes at CHC, dual enrollment, or Middle college Students
- There were questions about summer counting as continuous enrollment that caused confusion
- Only allowed for the first year a student started or the year of completion

1. Catalog Rights at the time the student begins at SBVC without interruption, or
2. The student who drops out for two or more consecutive semesters is subject to the requirements in the catalog at the time of reentry, or
3. The catalog in effect at the time the graduation petition is submitted.

Note: Summer session course requirements are included in the catalog of the previous academic year.

Proposed SBVC Graduation Catalog

Rights Policy:

Catalog rights at San Bernardino Valley College (SBVC) are determined by the first term a student registers for courses at SBVC and/or Crafton Hills College (CHC), including courses offered through dual enrollment. Catalog rights remain with a student as long as they maintain continuous enrollment. A student may choose to fulfill graduation requirements from any academic year for which continuous enrollment is met.

- Inclusive of all students in the district
 - Increased opportunities for eligible catalog years for graduation
 - Defined verbiage of continuous enrollment
 - Clear policy that is student centered, students maintain enrollment as long as they take at least one class an academic year
- Understanding Continuous Enrollment:
- Continuous enrollment is defined as enrolling in at least one course during each academic year at SBVC and/or CHC, including courses offered through dual enrollment (Fall, Spring, Summer).
 - Any academic record symbol (A, B, C, D, F, GR, NC, P, NP, I, IP, EW, FW, or W) counts as enrollment.
