# PRESIDENT'S REPORT – D. RODRIGUEZ

Due to the postponement of Rania's agenda topic, Diana offered to conduct an exercise involving 2.98 from the 2017 SBVC Educational Master Plan utilizing the TRIZ method as presented by Scott Thayer and Celia Huston (see attached.)

The TRIZ method is an interactive method of examination/exploration that was demonstrated at the *Change Leadership Summit* attended by Scott and Celia, among other SBVC employees, during the FA17 semester.

- 1. "Make a list of all you can do to make sure that you achieve the worst result imaginable with respect to your top strategy or objective."
- 2. "Go down this list item by item and ask yourselves, 'Is there anything that we are currently doing that in any way, shape, or form resembles this item?' Be brutally honest to make a second list of all your counterproductive activities/programs/procedures."
- 3. "Go through the items on your second list and decide what first steps will help you stop what you know creates undesirable results?"

College Council members broke into groups, as lead by Scott Thayer, to review *Commitments for the Future: Improving Student Success by Strengthening Coordination between Student Services, Instruction and Academic Support* (2.98 of the *SBVC Educational Master Plan.*) College Council members applied the TRIZ method, making notes on easel pads, and then followed with group discussions of their findings.
