PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Strategic Plan Progress Review with College Council Input

Scott Stark distributed a College Council Input worksheet "SBVC Strategic Goals and Objectives Progress and Mapping Document" and included the San Bernardino Community College District Proposed New Funding Formula Analysis by Funding Element as a funding formula guide.

Scott explained that he will conduct a College Council work session, taking a look at the college's Strategic Goals and Objectives that were developed approximately five years ago. Last year the goals and objectives were reviewed in a full-day session by the executive team to determine the highlights/accomplishments toward the goals and objectives — all, but several, were either completed, established, achieved, or significantly in-progress at that time. Recently, the executive team conducted another full-day work session to again update the highlights/accomplishments, and added additional alignment columns to indicate how well our plan maps to accreditation standards, statewide initiatives, and the new funding formula.

Today, College Council will begin to review the Goals & Objectives to obtain collective input on items the executive team may have missed while simultaneously determining alignment with accreditation, statewide initiatives, and the new funding formula.
