President's Report:

Vice Presidents' Reports: D. Humble: This is day 3 of the Accreditation process and thanked the visiting team for their time and efforts. The spring schedule will be going live in the next couple of days. Priority registration starts November 2, 2020. The tutoring and writing center are serving more students since we have had the online virtual services. San Bernardino Valley College is working on a partnership with Start Up, San Bernardino Unified School District, Rialto Unified School District, Tesla, and Southern California Edison. There will be a webinar on high school and college students that are focusing on student's color and women in career technical and workforce development. S. Stark: Measure CC is on track and the building is in review with the Division of the State of Architect. It will take at least 6 months for them to review and give their comments. The student services building user group will start in early to mid-spring. The softball field is in the initial stages of planning, located at the corner of Esperanza and K Street. The library re-roofing project is on schedule and will be completed in mid-November. Disinfecting and hand sanitizing stations are located all over campus.
