- As a follow-up from last College Council, Dr.
 Contreras provided an update concerning the
 \$200k allocated for OER/ZTC. He confirmed
 that the funds are still available and that the
 BookSaver program will not impact these
 funds. He expressed the need to make
 progress on advancing OER & ZTC.
- Dr. Contreras informed the committee that SBVC had to cancel our football season due to a decrease in the number of students participating due to injuries, with only 25 players, it was decided to prioritize the health and safety of our athletes. The student-athletes were included in decision-making where they unanimously agreed to cancel the season to protect their eligibility.
- Information is being gathered on how to restructure athletics, possibly making organizational changes or realigning areas to avoid being in a similar position next year.
- Dr. Contreras expressed interest in adding adding a women's flag football team, as it is now a locally recognized CIF sport, and SBVC could be among the first to have such a team.
- He announced there will be more information about the options available and the direction SBVC will be taking to better position ourselves for next year and the significant opportunities to retain students.
- Dr. Contreras thanked the cabinet for their support and mentioned Dr. Rosas' dedication to athletics.
- Dr. Contreras initiated a discussion on how people received the Mental Health update from the last College Council and what steps are being taken to look at options to

Burns-Peters provided an update on program review and the need to codify program requirements. This led to discussion on the challenges of managing requests and the need for a consistent process. The document presented showed unused funds. This information initiated a discussion to encourage departments and managers to spend the funds allocated through program review. The committee members sought clarity on knowledge or common understanding of the process of how to spend program review funds and Program Review deadlines. Dr. Contreras stated that the college will work with the management team to understand the process and the management team will be responsible to ensure that the funds will be spent. Dr. Contreras recommended that VPAS K. Bacon provide additional training sessions to help the campus community to understand the

	process, including deadlines. VPAS K. Bacon will come back in the spring with training information sessions.

Thompson provided an update to College Council about the progress being made by the Dual Enrollment workgroup defining the "pain points" of how faculty are experiencing the SBVC Dual Enrollment program. B. Thompson mentioned that there was a high turnout at the most recent Dual Enrollment meeting. At the meeting, they focused on gathering faculty feedback on "pain points" related to dual enrollment and will be engaging with K-12 partners to understand their perspectives on dual enrollment.
