New Business	<p>Math – The Math department wanted to know if they can make MATH 108 and precalculus as a 5-unit course to integrate the corequisites into each course. Per Janice, there are some colleges that have statistics as a 5-units course. This course would be considered a “stretch” mathematics courses that has remedial and transferable content. Increasing the units is not the worst thing to do, but what are the ramifications? PSYCH and ECON are connected to this course, will they increase their units, too? The units of the transfer degree would be increased, too. There are separate courses that have the 5-unit course in addition to the three-unit course, but these courses have an ‘S’ with the number. The Math department is looking at various options to support all students at all levels. For the precalculus course, the UC-TCA, they have a maximum of five-semester units when transferring. If students have to take college algebra and then having to take precalculus, they will be cut off from the credits.</p> <p>MATH 095-096: The Math department will no longer be offering MATH 095/096 beginning Fall 2022. For all students who need to take these courses for a graduation requirement will need to take MATH 601 and then take a credit by exam in order to meet this graduation requirement. The Math department will be creating a note to be added to the catalog’s graduation requirement to keep students informed.</p>
