1. Minutes for Review	Review and approval of prior meeting minutes.	Heather Johnson made a motion to approve the May 9, 2017 meeting minutes, Marco Cota seconded, Ernesto Nery abstained, Motion carried.
2. Cindy to provide an update on summer outreach with draft dates for churches and an update on community outreach. Where are we with Valley in the Community Output Description:	Cindy Huerta covers flyers that she dissimenated to the committee showcasing her "Super Sundays" which she explained were days that SBVC could showcase our programs and services for recruitment purposes. Cindy also passed around a sign up list for staff and faculty to help work the outreach booth at these events, she will send it out electronically as well. The three dates are June 25, July 9 and July 23, 2017 and will be located at various local churches. Cindy went on to explain that the first date on June 25, will be held and Ecclesia Chruch and will be a table plus a 30 minute presentation. It is part of a program the church is running for educational Sundays. Dr. Shabazz continued to say he hopes Valley as a whole starts to become more involved. He would like to see a Institutional Community Campaign to get people involved. Valley in the community was a great event, and felt that it had a great impact on the students and staff that participated. It is Cindy's job to cooridinate not to do it all.	Several members of the committee signed up for Super Sundays and will make more of an effort to become more involved.

April to provide an update on the drop number for who owes fees and the concurrent enrollment plan	April Dale Carter stated that she is continuting her work on the concurrent enrollment plan, specifically the timeline of the process. She has been meeting with different school sites to get afeel for how the process is done; right now valley has about a two week turn around to process paperwork, depending on how many school are involved it could be extended to 3 to 4 weeks. There will also be two reps accompanying Cindy on certain outreach trips to assist with on site registration. April stated that for the apring 2017 smester, there are 904 students who have an outstanding balance owed with a total of \$248, 262.00. We are waiting on the numbers for Summer and Fall, the infomartion will be sent out when it is available. Dr. Shabazz stated for an instution of this size he believes those numbers to be normal. He asked if it was possible to know who the students are? Athlets? Specialized program studnets?	April Carter will send out summer and fall numbers when they become avaibale. For clarification purposes, April stated, the 904 with outsestding balances wwere not allowed to register for any aummer courses.
Carmen to provide an update on VB and FYE, and summer bridge	Carmen Rodriguez gives a quick overview of Valleyound. There are 250 stuents expected to attend their summer bridge July 3 through July 13, 2017, and will be registed for fall on July 13. The First Year Experience Program will run their summer bridge July 17 though August 3, 2017. Carmen has met with and been in communication with the students to explain the commintment they	No Action taken
James to talk about summer and fall numbers	Dr. Smith referred to the daily snapshot handout enrollment for spring and summer comparisons to previous years semesters. Due to the efforts of outreach we exceeded our spring enrollment. Outreach has been helping to build our cooncureent enrollment as well as non-credit courses. If noncredit courses can be lined to a cost, out FTE's will go up and we can receive additional funding. April Carter brought up a valid point in out FTE's and outstanding debts. She stated that she has begun to recived emails about late grade posting's, or many instructors never drop students so we get the funds, but the students aren't actually completed the courses. Dr. Shabazz feels that is something that can be covered by their deans in department meetings. Faculty have to understand the impact that has on students in regards to poting grades late. April stated that she has seen an increase, and was told by one faculty member that they were told not to drop students. Dr. Briggs stated she makes it very clear that if you have a no show they are to drop. She also said that many years ago, facukty would face some sort of consequence for posting grade late. Dr. Sgabazz asked if the committee could table this discussion for another time, believes it is important a needs to be discussed at further length. Dr. Shabazz thanked the committee and expressed his well wishes for the campus and staff. 
