Enrollment Update	 Up about 13% from this time last year We're at almost 40% more head count from where we were last year this time We're currently sitting at about 80% fill rate We're way over our funded FTES – conversations about merging lower enrolled classes Online programs might help offset the space issue Recommendation – some classes can be offered fully online instead of hybrid One of the infrastructures we used to have on campus was the weekend, evening college and distance learning college office We need to have staff there to help those come to campus that often 	

2. Student Equity Plan Update/Submission	December 31st is the first report due for Student Equity Achievement Program (SEA Program) That is Basic Skills, Student Equity and SSSP The last EEO meeting there was a discussion on where we are at when it comes to diversity amongst staff and faculty. The State EEO funds are becoming more harder to access; they're going to look for actual gains in certain areas to actually have access to those funds. There is a push to have more collaborations between EEO, HIS, Latino Faculty and Staff, Black Faculty and Staff, Arts Lecture and Diversity, and this committee. The plan is to have a joint diversity equity meeting to talk about what the challenges are in the EEO Plan and also how they can be better interconnected with the Diversity Plan, Student Equity Plan that we're supposed to address. We have been asked to create a job fair event where staff and faculty who currently work on campus can get training to increase their ability to promote.
