SBVCGP Missions

~ San Bernardino Valley College's Guided Pathways mission is to provide student centered service with transparent focus and commitment by putting student success first through easy access, clear direction and continued support in as little time possible. With campus wide awareness involving the entire faculty and staff here at San Bernardino Valley College!

SBVCGP Charge

Guided Pathways is a student-centered approach that can dramatically increase the number of students earning community college credentials, while closing equity gaps. Rather than work with a subset of students, Guided Pathways is a college-wide undertaking that provides a framework for integrating California-based initiatives such as SSSP, Equity, Basic Skills Transformation, the Strong Workforce Program, and California College Promise. The California Guided Pathways project was modeled from the American Association of Community Colleges (AACC) Pathways Project and adapted for implementation in California. San Bernardino Valley College is implementing this model to increase student success by clarifying academic/career paths to student end goals, helping students to choose, stay on path and ensure quality learning.

2019/2020 Updates:

- Mapping (Ty): Last year we looked at took all the transfer degrees but did not complete mapping them all. We would like to pick this back up and continue working on these however, this will not be our priority focus for the year.
- Scheduling (Dmitriy): We are going to move forward with the scheduling in creating maps for the non-traditional students and those who may get looked over.
- Continued website redesign efforts (Matt): The website was completed last year, and everyone has had time to poke around and look at what is there. Part of this committee's responsibility will be to look and continue to make the website better and keep it updated. John added that we continue to monitor the data that comes out that we report to the state and this needs to stay in the forefront.

2020/2021 Open Topic Discussions

- Engage Students (incorporating student voices, cultural responses, etc.) (John): Looking at our students and looking at how those maps will apply to those students, we need to understand how curriculum applies in a four year model. We should serve these students, but these are not our students. We need to be sure we remain focused on "our" students and their goals as well. He has some ideas but feels that the committee should discuss what the actual goals should be.
- Student Survey (John): We need to ask them directly about things such as what they want. We also need to include students in groups such as this committee. We also need to evaluate our

hiring processes to ensure equity, evaluate our processes for progression in ranks, how do we link together Art's and Lecture with Academic Senate, and other areas that we can focus on. There was some discussion on others who may be able to assist in certain areas that we are discussing as well as assisting students in navigating the on-line learning and both were noted.

- Student Success Teams (Ty): This is basically the team of those who will support each student. Different schools call them different things, but we need to look at what their needs are. What we are looking at is surveying what they students need now. Our support teams will include a counselor, someone from Financial Aid, Admissions and Records, someone from the Business Office, and possibly a peer advisor. There was some conversation regarding what this team and their services will look like and there was clarification given by Ty, John, and Matt.
- Guided Pathways campus engagement efforts (Matt): We need to really attack this this year. We need to find others who want to be involved where we had classified and faculty come to meetings and maybe we could work with Professional Development to work on ways to encourage people to participate and engage all aspects of campus. Matt asked for the committee's thoughts on this topic and offered that it is important to communicate, out to the campus, the great work we are doing. Matt also offered that we are working together with our counterparts at our local 4-year institutions as we are all focused to the success of our student, both on our campus and moving forward. Ty mentioned that she's been approached by National University and others, to work with them on preparing our students to move forward to their campuses.
- In summary, the committee discussed its goals for the 2020-2021 academic year and they are as follows:
 - 1. Include student voices in the SBVC Guided Pathways effort. This includes:
 - a. asking the Associated Student Government for two student representatives on the committee
 - b. Working with the Research and Planning office to collect data, perhaps both qualitative and quantitative, about our onboarding processes, career field guides, and other observations about how students interface with the college and what they want from the college in terms of support.
 - 2. Engage the campus in mapping programs of study for OUR students. Possibly create student profiles, evaluate the availability of instructional and support services through a variety of lenses that reflect our student population.
 - 3. Actively collaborate with the Academic Senate, Professional Development, Classified Senate, and other existing structures of the college to create a cohesive plan that infuses both guided pathways and anti-racism/no-hate goals of the institution.
 - 4. Evaluate career development tools currently on hand and inform the entire campus about the tools and resources available to students.
 - 5. Evaluate and propose changes to the hiring processes of the district with a lens toward racial justice and equity.

- 6. Support and/or lead campus dialogue about culturally responsive andragogy.
- 7. Evaluate student success and support team models from other campuses and determine their effectiveness or appropriateness for our students.
