2020 – 2021 Year End Report

Anthony Castro: Early Alert Systems: (Starfish) Updates to the website, it's the first introduction to incoming students. Other schools have implemented some sort of dashboard. It would be helpful if the students could view their progress by using a pie chart or map. Star fish early alert are being used on other campuses. Support in gatekeeper courses with AB705. Work with campus committees to make sure paths stay up to date. Curriculum process. Ensure that learning is happening with intentional outcomes.

Luca Cuny Shared: Meeting with KVCR on an internship pipeline. It's starting with the FT VM students. Down the road there is going to be pathways for finance and business students to get in there. Possibly special projects that faculty could assign for student's long term work experience opportunities. This could be a key to our success.

Kyle Stroud shared: Guided Pathways 2020/2021 Year end Summary. Sophia will continue with us, and they will work on getting another ASG representative. With the help of research and planning they completed 20 top general education classes that students complete here at SBVC. Counselors used these classes to develop additional maps for students.

Keenan Giles Shared: During the summer a group of 16 counselors completed maps based on the 20 top general education classes. Adding the general ed requirements.

Tahirah Simpson: Provided an update, that she did share the work that was completed around the teachers of color and Kathleen confirmed the work will continue. There are expectations from both CSU and San Bernardino City Unified. San Manuel still want to connect with SBVC in terms of getting some resources and pathways for their population. So hopefully we can improve our native American populations.
