Men in Mathematics Event Stresses Importance of STEM in Career Settings




Professionals from a wide variety of industries including architecture, construction, and public safety participated in the *Empowering Men in Mathematics and Science* event held on Friday, September 27, 2013.

Joining SBVC students were local high school students with an interest in the STEM fields (science, technology, engineering and mathematics). Hosted once again by SBVC Mathematics Professor Michael Mayne, the event focused on the achievements and contributions of males who have applied knowledge in the areas of math and science into their professional careers. A special focus was given to how traditionally underrepresented males can take advantage of the many opportunities available with knowledge in the STEM fields.

The event was made possible as part of the PASS GO grant funding from the U.S. Department of Education Hispanic Serving Institution (HSI) STEM and Articulation Cooperative Grant.



Activities during the week included: A lecture on environmental justice by SBVC professor Dr. Todd Heibel, a

screening hosted by Lillian Vasquez of KVCR in advance of the debut of the new PBS documentary "Latinos," and a reception in the Clara & Allen Gresham Art Gallery celebrating 30 years of artwork created by SBVC Art Professor David Rosales.



Student Success Center Holds Open House



On August 23, the Student Success Center hosted an open house to raise the profile of the Student Success Center across campus. The event was attended by more than 110 students, staff, and faculty. Also in attendance at the event were the STEM Pass Go team, supplemental instruction leaders, Science Division Dean Dr. Susan Bangasser, the Student Success Center Coordinator, presenters from UCR and CSUSB, and representatives from SBVC programs in GIS, Math, Chemistry and Physics. Topics included cloning genomes from mosquitos that carry yellow fever, developments of mapping systems in the San Bernardino area, cell type differences in the role of host Nxf1 for influenza NP m RNA nuclear export, physics fuel cells, and an inter-comparison of forward radioactive transfer computer models. In addition, current and former students who participated in summer research experiences were able to present their posters. The students answered questions and inspired other students to participate in research opportunities.

<u>EOPS/CARE</u> – Now serving 625 students for fall 2013, the program has provided 100 books through the textbook loan program.

<u>Student Health Services</u> - Faculty and staff enjoyed some pampering and quiet time from the stresses of the semester at the first of monthly "Stress Solutions Oasis" events on August 29 & September 26. In post-event evaluations participants reported elevated mood and a sense of wellbeing and relaxation after participating. This project was funded by a Campus Mental Health Program grant.

<u>Admissions & Records</u> – 361 students have already applied for the spring 2014 semester (registration begins during the week of Thanksgiving).

<u>Assessment</u> – A total of 7,813 students were tested during the last academic year—including tests given at 10 feeder high schools where 618 potential SBVC students were assessed. Sessions for special populations (Big Bear, veterans, student-athletes, Middle College High School) were also held throughout the year.



<u>Financial Aid</u> – As of September 13th, 25,834 FAFSA applications have been received for the 2013-2014 academic year. The Financial Aid office has disbursed \$1,943,371 in Pell grant funds this academic year. A total of 2,002 Cal Grants amounting to \$294,479 has been awarded to SBVC students—55 of which are for eligible AB540 students (equal to \$76,385). CSAC will continue awarding students throughout the year. The first round of Chafee Foster Youth grant payments will arrive soon and provide an additional \$110,000 in aid to 44 foster youth students.

<u>Transfer & Career Services</u> - The Transfer Center computer lab will be open throughout October/November to assist students with the application process ahead of CSU and UC application deadlines and in support of the goal to ensure more UC transfer agreements for SBVC students in 2013-2014.

<u>Puente Project</u> - SBVC was selected as one of three southern California community college Puente programs to participate in the Student Leadership Strand of the Unity Conference at the Del Mar Hilton in San Diego on Saturday, October 5, 2013. Jointly sponsored by the California Latino School Boards Association and the California Black School Boards Association, the event brought together legislators, elected school officials, administrators, education advocates, and other stakeholders to talk about issues impacting Latino students. SBVC's Puente students benefited from the complimentary registration and event access (a \$250 value).

<u>Disabled Student Programs & Services (DSP&S)</u> - DSPS is serving 836 students during the fall semester. Counseling appointments are full each day and new students are applying for services every week.

<u>Veterans Resource Center (VRC)</u> – A total of 109 educational goal plans have been developed for fall semester by the halftime counselor in the VRC. There were 476 contact visits for other business in the VRC during the months of July and August.
