

## Overview

- SBVC has a long history of concurrent enrollment
- SBVC has offered courses at off-site locations for many years
- Concurrent enrollment provides High School
   Students with an opportunity to start college early
- Concurrent enrollment provides SBVC the opportunity to grow FTES



## Definitions

#### • Concurrent enrollment students:

• Concurrent enrollment students are students enrolled in high school who are taking classes at SBVC or off-site in courses open to the general public. High school students enrolled as concurrent enrollment must follow all guidelines and rules as stipulated in the College Catalog pp. 5-6.

#### • Dual enrollment students:

• Dual enrollment students are students enrolled in College and Career Access Pathways Partnerships (CCAP) courses through Assembly Bill 288 (AB 288). These proposed sections will be off-site and are closed to the general public

## Definitions

- Mandated Reporter
  - Mandated **reporters** are people who have regular contact with vulnerable people and are therefore legally required to ensure a report is made when abuse is observed or suspected.



- What are the qualifications for instructors teaching sections offered as concurrent enrollment or in CCAP program?
  - All instructors for sections offered either as concurrent enrollment of as part of a CCAP partnership will be required to meet minimum qualifications for content areas and fields of study as articulated by State Chancellor's Office.


- What is level of academic rigor associated with a concurrent enrollment course offering or a course as part of a CCAP program?
  - All syllabi for these courses will adhere to the course outline of record (COR). The expectations for academic rigor and course quality are exactly the same as for all courses offered through SBVC.

- Where will courses under these headings be offered?
  - Students enrolled as concurrent enrollment students may take courses at SBVC or off-site in courses open to the general public.
  - Students enrolled under a CCAP partnership as dual enrollment students will take courses at an off-site location in courses closed to the general public.

- Who is eligible to participate?
  - Faculty
    - Faculty employed by SBCCD may be assigned classes at off-site locations.
  - Students
    - Students in 10<sup>th</sup> through 12<sup>th</sup> grades with a minimum of a 3.0 GPA and a recommendation from their high school principal or counselor are eligible to participate in college academic courses. A 2.0 GPA is required for participation in CTE courses.

#### Misconceptions and Realities

- Courses taught at the high schools do not have the same rigor as our courses at SBVC
  - Courses utilize the same outline of record no matter where they are taught
- High school faculty will be hired to teach these courses
  - All faculty are hired using the same processes. Faculty teaching these courses will be sbvc faculty
- The high school contract will be in force for faculty teaching at the high schools
  - The SBCCD faculty contract will be in full effect, including workload (our calendar) and evaluation



## Concerns/issues

- How do we deal with behavior issues?
- What will the educational space be like?
- Will there be training available?
- What is expected of me as a mandated reporter?



# Next Steps

- SBVC will host meetings with districts to make final course selections
- There will be a pilot program during Fall, 2017 with limited numbers of courses offered at area high schools
- Faculty selected to teach at the high school campuses will be provided training
- The campus will continue work to establish AB 288 (Pathways agreements for dual enrollment) with area high schools
