Using the dashboards allowed me to understand where we are succeeding and where we can do more work.





# **Updated Student Metric Data**

#### ✓ Successful Enrollment

Over 40% of applicants successfully enroll by the Spring term of the academic year they first applied for.



Ensuring that all students have the support they need to succeed is a key priority for our campus. To track our progress, we focus on five key metrics throughout the student academic journey.


# Transfer-Level Math & English

Students are prioritizing either Math or English in their first academic year of enrollment.




#### Term-to-Term Persistence

~50% of first-time students are persisting from their first primary term (Fall or Spring) to their second primary term.



### Vision Goal Completion (Graduation)

A higher percentage of students are graduating within three years of starting at SBVC.



### 荐 Transfer to a 4-Year University

A higher percentage of students are transferring within four years of starting at SBVC.



Students who started in Spring 2021 have until Spring 2025 to transfer.

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
