## How the Basic Skills Committee has Transformed the ESL Program at San Bernardino Valley College

The Basic Skills Committee (BSC) plays a crucial role at the college, overseeing the implementation of the campus basic skills plan and supporting proposals that enhance student success. This news- letter showcases how Basic Skills funding has empowered projects led by Dr. Dirkson Lee, Leticia Hector, and Dr. Paula Ferri-Milligan, focusing on the ESL program's resilience during the 2020 pandemic-induced attendance decline.

To address the challenges, Dr. Lee and his team utilized BSC funding to launch a successful outreach campaign, producing multilingual mailers to inform diverse communities about ESL classes. The initiative not only revitalized interest but also prompted additional support from ESL counselors Maria Lopez and Pedro Gonzalez, leading to the introduction of a dedicated ESL counselor and clerical support, resulting in increased retention and fewer class cancellations. Expanding beyond campus, the ESL program partnered with community organizations, thanks to Basic Skills funding, establishing satellite classes at Urbita Elementary School and the Feldheym Library. This outreach effort, supported by administrators and staff, contributed to a substantial increase in course offerings, demonstrating how BSC resources positively impact projects and programs at San Bernardino Valley College.
