- Prenatal & postnatal causes of mental retardation: from exposure to alcohol, illness.
- •Neurological disorders autism, cerebral palsy, hydrocephalus, seizures

- Tracheostomy


#### Insertion of:

## Program Timeline




#### Application to the Program

Include assessments and counselor approved ed plan with all other info required for application

- Can manage stress in a healthy manner
- Is hopeful and recognizes that human behavior is dynamic and can be changed.

#### Licensure



- To find employment as a Psychiatric Technician, the candidate upon completion of the program must successfully pass a licensing exam administered by the Board of Vocational Nursing and Psychiatric Technicians.
- Upon passing the exam, the candidate must apply for the license cost \$ 300. (If employed by a State agency, the cost is reimbursed to the Psychiatric Technician).
- Every 2 years, the PT must complete 30 Continuing Education Units (C.E.U.s) and renew their license.
