SAO Assessment Tool	Program Review process in fall 2018 and spring 2019. Additionally, Presence, the student engagement software, was used to assess engagement.
Criteria – What is "good enough"? Rubric	Per our previous Program Review outcomes, Student Life, and the Associated Student Government, had not historically captured event attendance at the level that is needed for valid assessment. Therefore, Student Life invested in the student engagement software, Presence. This year, the outcome is to create a baseline for future comparisons and evaluations.
What are the results of the assessment? Are the results satisfactory?	Student participation in 77 events totaled 3,762 for the 2019-2020 academic year. 1,552 students participated in more than one event (41.3 percent). Fall 2019 included 2,454 students which is 17.5% student engagement (11.4 percent for unique students), and Spring 2020 included 1,308 students which was a 11% engagement (7.9 percent for unique students). Average attendance was 48.86 students per event. Additional data includes 48% of participants identified as Hispanic, 30% male, and 70% female in fall 2019, and 63% of participants identified as Hispanic, 46% male, and 54% female in spring 2020. The results are satisfactory in creating the baseline for information needed to assess student engagement.
Were trends evident in the outcomes? Are there gaps?	Past trends were not evident in the outcomes based on the baseline information that is currently in place. However, future assessments will show trends and further data analysis will look at gaps related to student demographics, specifically ethnicity and majors.
What content, structure, strategies might improve outcomes?	A major initiative that will improve outcomes is to continue our efforts of encouraging other programs to use Presence for all their events. This will allow us to adequately measure student engagement, identify gaps, and to collaborate on strategies to increase engagement.
Will you change evaluation/assessment method or criteria?	Yes, future evaluations will be completed against the data above to show trends. Data will be disaggregated to majors and ethnicity.
