1. Approval of 10/28/2021 Minutes.	Carmen Rodriguez moved. Sharaf Williams seconded. Motion to approve Minutes as written passed.	
2. Remote Environment – January 18-February 25, 2022	Students and staff are adjusting to the remote schedule.	Updates will be provided every two weeks.
3. Information Tables-Spring 2022	Approximately 500 students were served the first three days of the semester. Students were very appreciative.	Joseph will try to add a location near the Tech Building for fall semester. More people answering phones the first few days of the semester will be reviewed.

<p>4. Spring 2022 Registration</p>	<p>3312 FTE's this morning compared to 3897 last year and hopefully this will recover by fall. We continued with our phone banking and have made close to 2900 phone calls, many of which were not good numbers.</p> <p>Olivia received Central Valley information from Kyle Stroud regarding free tuition, fee waivers, and expanded marketing campaign at Modesto.</p> <p>Student debt has been forgiven for six semesters (Spring 2020 to Summer 2021) and it's being reviewed to determine if there are funds available to cover debt for Fall 2021. Students were notified about this in December.</p> <p>Students enrolled in the Spring 2022 semester will be eligible for HEERF III fund money in March. ALL students should be receiving funds, either \$800, \$500 or \$400.</p> <p>Ray is sending a survey to students next week asking how things are going.</p>	<p>Marketing is working on a campaign and if you have any ideas, email them to Olivia with a cc: to Suzan and she will forward them to Paul.</p> <p>Encourage students to update their information in webadvisor.</p> <p>Suzan will send the link to the group.</p> <p>Suzan will forward to the Council the December email that went out to students.</p> <p>Ray sent the survey link to the Council to review.</p>
<p>5. Vaccination Mandate Update</p>	<p>Beginning February 1, the Covid testing Clinic on campus will offer both the antigen test (PCR) and rapid test.</p>	<p>Open to all employees right now and students will be notified next week with instructions on uploading their vaccination card or exemption form.</p>

<p>6. Area Updates</p>	<p>Andrea met with ConexEd and shared "Private Hub," a small booth that can be put around campus and is confidential so students can speak with a counselor.</p> <p>Olivia shared California Volunteers, Office of the Governor grant and CaliforniansForAll College Corps program. This program is open to all students, including AB540 eligible DREAMers. and will provide students over two academic years with service opportunities in critical issue areas and those who are accepted, will receive \$10,000 per year for 450 hours of volunteer service.</p> <p>Shalita hired 4 student ambassadors to provide vaccine education to students and they will receive \$1000 per month from January thru March. She has a fresh success program to be implemented in October.</p> <p>EOPS continues to accept applications for spring and has done six sessions as a spring kickoff to remind students we are here for them.</p> <p>Andrea reported more students are utilizing the Instagram account and the subscription button on the campus shell is available now to answer questions students might have after hours.</p> <p>Elaine said they will have groups for students online that are largely on stress, mental health and some health topics. She is working with Joanna on an extensive healthy minds survey for all students.</p> <p>April reminded everyone the Census date is February 7 so rosters should be updated; spring graduation deadline is March 1 and summer graduation deadline is March 2.</p> <p>Kathy said the new Honors Counselor is Andrea Rodriguez who will work Tuesday and Wednesday in the Transfer Center.</p> <p>EMP forms due January 31 to Nancy in Marco's office.</p>	<p>We are charged with identifying 70 students from SBVC and 30 students from CHC. More information to come.</p> <p>Continue to send students their way.</p> <p>Late adds and expired add codes, email Veada Benjamin.</p>
