

Colleagues,

This past Tuesday, SBVC held its inaugural Student Success Summit. In attendance were some 80 people representing faculty, staff, administration, students, as well as individuals from the San Bernardino and Chino Valley Unified School Districts, the San Bernardino County Superintendent of Schools, Cal State San Bernardino, the San Bernardino County Board of Education, the San Bernardino Community College Board of Trustees, and individuals representing the local business community.

The goal of the Summit was to identify ways of uniting community assets to promote college readiness and to improve student retention, completion, transfer, and employment rates.

I had hoped that a few good ideas would emerge from the conversations which I could then share with you. I also hoped that we might begin to work on some of those ideas immediately. My hopes were exceeded beyond my wildest expectations. Participants prepared and submitted nearly 200 5" X 7" Post-It Notes, most of which contained multiple suggestions, outlining recommendations ranging from improving communication to revisiting the college's mission statement.

I can't begin to share every idea with you in the format of this newsletter. But I want to pass on some of the thoughts that were shared and let you know what next steps I hope to take in addressing them.

<u>IDEA</u>: "We should develop greater inter-departmental academic planning and resource-sharing processes."

<u>ACTION STEP</u>: I will be addressing this idea with deans and department chairs at the next department chair meeting.

<u>IDEA</u>: "We should develop an Orientation Day and College Night to showcase the campus to the community."

<u>ACTION STEP</u>: I am going to meet with the Student Services staff to consider planning for such events.









<u>IDEA</u>: "SBVC students need the high schools and CSUs to more closely coordinate curriculum and standards."

<u>ACTION STEP</u>: I am meeting with the CSUSB President, the County Superintendent of Schools, and the Assistant Superintendent of SBCUSD in the coming weeks to develop pathways to meet this very goal.

IDEA: "We need to promote internships with local employers."

<u>ACTION STEP</u>: I am meeting with the Vice President of Instruction to address developing and scheduling internship classes as early as the fall semester."

IDEA: "We need to revisit the college's mission statement."

<u>ACTION STEP</u>: I will place this item on the agenda for the next College Council meeting with the intention of developing a committee, in coordination with our accreditation efforts, to review our mission statement.

These are just a few of the recommendations that emerged during the Summit. I have prepared a <u>more comprehensive list of suggestions</u> for the entire campus to review.

I will continue to update you on our efforts to address the imaginative and thoughtful responses that poured out from Summit participants. And, in the interest of inclusivity and continuing the dialog, I am inviting each of you to share your comments and further suggestions by answering the question below:

Which of the suggestions from the Student Success Summit do you believe are most important in fostering student success at SBVC and why?

Thanks to all of you who made this one of the best events I have been a part of in my 28 years working in universities and community colleges!








Transfer Fair Arrives on Wednesday


Club Wars Returns to SBVC on Thursday
