## Letter from Barbara Beno 1/31/13

 Recent regulations require institutions to set standards for student achievement: These standards may be tailored to the institution and its mission. The regulations also require accreditors to ask institutions to assess their own performance against the institution set standards for student achievement.

- Standards must effectively address success with respect to student achievement in relation to the institutions mission... including as appropriate course completion, licensing examinations, and job placement rates
   34 CFR 602.16 (a) (1) (i)
- Agency reports must assess institutional performance with respect to institution-set student achievement standards 34 CFR 602.17 (f)
- The team also examines program/certificate completion data and graduation data provided by the college.

- Evaluation teams examine the institution-set standards for student success and achievement and assess their appropriateness.
- Data is examined in the context of the institution-set standards of satisfactory performance and goals for improvement of student success
- The evaluation team cites this information as evidence of the institution's accomplishment of mission.
- The evaluation teams report cites the use of this evidence in describing its evaluation of how well the institution fulfills its mission.

### **Establish Processes**
