Administrative Considerations

- 1. Preserve basic necessities for educational environment
 - a. Maintenance
 - b. Grounds
 - c. Custodial

Student Services Considerations

- 1. Preserve programs that serve the entire student population
- 2. Preserve programs that cost little or no General Fund money

Instructional Services

- 1. Preserve programs and courses that lead to transfer and degrees
 - a. CA public universities
 - b. Then private or out of state
- 2. Preserve programs and courses that lead to a certificate and employment utilizing labor market indicators
 - a. In our community
 - b. In Southern California
 - c. In California
- 3. Preserve a pathway for students from basic skills to the transfer level (find a ratio of low, middle, and transfer level courses to ensure a viable pathway for entry and continuing students, e.g., 10-60-30)
- 4. Maintain programs and courses that preserve a diversity of students reflective of our community
- 5. Preserve a diversity of course offerings, as much as possible, to provide students choices in general education

Evaluate Efficiencies that can save money in

- 1. Current classified staffing levels
- 2. Current administrative staffing levels
- 3. Landscaping
- 4. Explore viability of outsourcing bookstore & food services
- 5. Reduce district budget
- 6. Work to change student culture
 - a. Pre-assessment workshops to help student assessment for placement
 - b. Messaging about number of times a course can be repeated, perhaps reduce to two times
