

Resolution FA15.03 ACCJC Follow-up Report Expectations

SBVC Academic Senate Executive Committee

Whereas, faculty roles and involvement in accreditation processes, including self-study and annual reports, are academic and professional matters as defined by Title 5 Section 53200;

Whereas, Board Policy 2510 states that “The Board embraces the concept of collegial consultation and to establish [sic] procedures to ensure faculty, management, classified staff, and students the right to participate effectively in collegial consultation in particular areas where they have their responsibility and expertise as specified in Title 5 regulations”;

Whereas, the Accrediting Commission for Community and Junior Colleges (ACCJC) found that the San Bernardino Community College District (SBCCD) and San Bernardino Valley College (SBVC) need to resolve several deficiencies by March 2016, and need to address the issues and demonstrate actions to resolve the noted deficiencies in their March 2016 Follow-up Report; and

Whereas, it is expected that the ACCJC Follow-up Report will describe how these deficiencies have been resolved and will include a narrative analysis of how effective those resolutions were, containing feedback from all campus constituencies and all accompanying evidence, including but not limited to:

- Resolution SP15.02 “Vote of No Confidence for Chancellor,” including all supporting evidence gathered and responses received;
- Resolution SP15.03 “ACCJC Commission Recommendation 1 and Minimum Eligibility Requirements for Chief Executive Officers” and any responses received;

Resolved, the SBVC Academic Senate reserves the right to not sign off on the report, and to submit its own third party complaint to the ACCJC, should these expectations for the Follow-up Report not be met.
