- Open discussion on the creation of an application form for "Basic Skills Mini-Projects" Issues discussed:
  - How faculty would be compensated for approved basic skills projects
    - Suggestion in wording that stipends may be available
  - Criteria or rubric should be developed
  - Administrative support should be provided, but not be micromanaged
  - On project approval form should not require dean's signature

- Deans should be informed of project proposals for basic skills
- Discussion was initiated on projects supported by Basic Skills funds
  - Projects previously supported by Basic Skills funds must complete a Basic Skills funding approval form to see the projects plans as well as to assess measurable outcomes
  - Suggestion was made to dialogue with departments affected by proposed projects in Basic Skills
- Discussion on whether departments want to provide pretest assessment workshops
  - Affected departments: Reading and English
- Introduction and discussion of supplemental instruction
  - Possible implementation of supplemental instruction in courses such as English
    - Ideal is to link a tutor/SI session to a class
  - One of the goals of supplemental instruction is to address the questions of "How does the college get students one or two levels below transfer level?"

#### 5. FINAL NOTES

- Representatives from the Basic Skills committee would propose the possibility of developing pretest assessment workshops to Reading and English departments
- Representatives from the Basic Skills committee would propose the possibility of using supplemental instruction tutors for the departments of English, math, reading and science
